Cogra Moss Conditions of Permit

1. NO FISH TO BE SOLD
2. ALL BROWN TROUT TO BE RETURNED TO THE WATER AS CAREFULLY AND QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE.
3. Fly fishing only, i.e fly rod (single handed only), fly reel and artificial barbless fly. All other methods including bubble float, strike indicators, spinning or the use of live or dead bait of any kind are strictly prohibited. Use of treble hooks, fly spoons or barbed hooks is also forbidden. Crimped barbs are allowed.
4. Anglers are allowed to take three sizeable trout per day and no more than 40 fish per season, i.e trout over 10" measured from tip of snout to fork of tail. Catch and Release is permitted on the following basis only: Anglers may not catch more than 10 fish on any single day; fishing must cease immediately that either the angler has caught and released 10 fish on any day, or as soon as the third fish has been killed. All coarse fish must be killed.
5. Fishing may commence at 8.00 am. No one shall enter the property before 7.45 am. Fishing must cease at sunset.
6. No person is allowed to fish without having first obtained a permit and paid the appropriate fee. The association reserves the right to withdraw or refuse to issue any permit.
7. Permit must be carried at all times and produced on request.
8. Catch returns must be posted in the returns box for each visit, this includes "nil" returns.
9. The appropriate Environment Agency licence must be held.
10. Thigh or knee waders preferred. Chest waders are allowed, wading no deeper than thigh wader depth.
11. No firearms or radios, and camping is not allowed. No fires to be lit.
12. No keep nets (landing nets must not be used to keep live fish in).
13. Boats or float tubes are not allowed.
14. No dogs are allowed with anglers.
15. It is the duty of all permit holders to notify the secretary / warden of any rule infringements. We must and we will act on any information we receive regarding the misuse of the Association's property. Remember it is in your interests to help with the policing of this unique still water fishery.
